FROM THE PRESIDENT

Amateur Radio earned high marks and frequent praise this month during a gathering for Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) homeland security grant recipients. During the meetings. "it was roundly acknowledged that Amateur Radio operators are always needed -- for assisting in the wake of blackouts, floods, earthquakes, fires and other emergencies." By the time this is published, we will have already experienced another year assisting a major community event in the form of the Cooper River Bridge Run. This major happening in the Lowcountry was rapidly speeding towards a cap of 42,000 participants (nearly 15,000 more than last year) as I "penned" this article. And as I remind folks each year, the experience of such events prepares us in many ways for the kinds of service we might be asked to provided in some less desirable events in our community - such as hurricanes, or mass evacuations. So, I salute your help to the Cooper River Bridge Run, and hope we will have some great experiences to write about for next month's newsletter!

In addition to practical lessons we can learn at the Bridge Run, I encourage you to enroll in the grant-funded emergency communications courses from ARRL before the grant window closes in June of 2005. To date, more than 4000 radio amateurs have taken advantage of these courses, and I think such training is important for amateur radio operators to understand the broader public safety context in which we must operate in order to contribute effectively in emergencies.

Turning our sights toward the next major event for the club after the Bridge Run, I look forward to hearing more on Field Day in upcoming meetings. Seasonally this is a great time for HF propagation, as the Northern Hemisphere passes into spring. But sunspot activity is low as we slip toward the bottom of this sunspot cycle, which will actually hit its low nearly two years from now. Still, HF bands are still active, and (with little more than a basic radio, some antenna wire, and some ambition to study for a license upgrade) the world can open up to you. My own contact last summer with a new 10W QRP HF rig with Albert, S58AL, in Slovenia was made using a wire dipole cut to tune up on 20M and hung in the attic!

We need to keep up the incentive for amateur radio operators to continue learning and pursuing upgrades, and Field Day provides a chance for everyone to get on the air. So whatever license class you hold, please make plans to participate. With the right control operator providing oversight, everyone can experience a taste of the excitement of HF operations. And it is always interesting to learn how that little nuclear furnace 93 million miles away continues to affect our everyday lives, as well as influence our hobby.

I look forward to seeing you at our next club meeting on Monday, April 11, 2005. If you helped with the Bridge Run, I also hope to see you at the Cooper River Bridge Run Volunteer Party on April 13 at James Island County Park.
