We had a wet, but very successful Cooper River Bridge Run on April 2. That may not seem like a big deal, but I have heard from dozens of runners - soggy from hours of standing in the rain – that they really appreciated not having any delays. Two weeks later at the Bridge Run Volunteer Party at James Island County Park, we enjoyed the hospitality and appreciation of the Bridge Run staff at the volunteer party. We had a great turnout for amateur radio! I want to thank you all for your support. Special thanks to Doug (KU4OC) for serving as the club's focal point for the event.

A recent article pointed out that some 14,000 teachers from across the US attended the recent National Science Teachers Association (NSTA) convention in Dallas, Texas. ARRL Education and Technology Program (ETP) Coordinator. Mark Spencer represented Amateur Radio, (WA8SME), and reported that the underlying theme and concern among the teachers was educational standards. "...teachers are overwhelmingly concerned about teaching to the standards, and if material isn't specifically addressed in the standards - word-forword, concept-for-concept - they were not particularly interested," he said. Spencer said many teachers told him that routine instruction at many schools comes to a halt this time of year so students can focus on prepping for standardized tests.

As we all know as amateur radio operators, applying broad math and science concepts in new situations is a fundamental skill. It is also an ability students must develop to succeed in the fast-paced society we now live in. I believe the opportunity we have through school programs, such as our own Big Project club being developed by Alene (KG4NKD) at DuBose Middle School, is a valuable opportunity to help the youth in our community understand more than just the answers to standardized test questions. Rather they develop the ability to apply fundamental science and math principles in real world environments. Alene has invited CARS members to help in the Dubose Middle School club. April and May will provide the chance for seasoned Hams to participate in demonstrations to the school club on all facets of amateur radio. Please consider taking advantage of this opportunity to share your experience and excitement about our hobby. Our first group of kids from DuBose will be testing in May to become the areas newest Hams. We need to keep them excited, and learning about their new hobby – one that promises a lifetime of adventure.

Field Day 2005 on June 25-26 will give us yet another opportunity to achieve this goal. Doc (W4MUR) reported out initial plans for this major event at our April meeting. CW or sideband, PSK 31 or satellite – there will be something to pique everyone's interest. So make plans to participate!

Field Day: Doc W4MUR

Rules for Field Day are out. A sign up sheet was passed around for the event, which will be June 25

and 26. Set up will start at 2 PM on Friday. Operations start at 2 PM on Saturday until 2 PM on Sunday. Doc needs help for setup on Friday and tear down on Sunday. Doc reported on rule changes limiting the maximum number of stations transmitting simultaneous signals. Doc is looking for a 6 M station operator, and queried the club about interest in an Emergency Operations Center station. Doc requested help from volunteers willing to participate with message handling (NTS) bulletin, GOTA station, 6 M, SB, Satellite, QRP, and digital modes. Several club members volunteered ideas for stations, and Doc recorded these ideas. Participation by the media and public officials was also discussed. A brief discussion of requirements for control operators for foreign station contacts was also held relating to third party agreement requirements.
