- 1. FCC amateur radio operator license.
- 2. A desire to help. (After you and your family are SAFE)
- 3. After ONE (1) year of ARES membership complete following:
 - 1. ICS 100
 - 2. ICS 200
 - 3. ICS 700
 - 4. ICS 800
 - 5. All courses are on the internet.
- 4. Optional courses recommended by ARRL, DHS, and FEMA.
