EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Welcome to the official start of the 2019 Atlantic Hurricane season. (1 June till 30 November) The first name "Andrea" has been used and the next name is "Barry". The weather service predicts an average season similar to last season so now is the time to prepare. Start assembling that "Go Bag" for each family member including pets, plan to stay or evacuate, prepare to help a neighbor or friend, get your travel plan and route in order. These are just some of the preparedness required during Hurricane season.

We have had two Hurricane Expo's so far, May 4, 2019 James Island Lowe's and 1 June, 2019 at Dorchester County Lowe's. Hope everyone had a chance to pick up stuff to help get ready for this season.

Hurricane's are NOT the only natural disasters that occur in this area. We have an earthquake region, and severe thunderstorms with tornadoes are possible. In the man made area we have a port downtown, trucks on the roads and never does an accident occur in the area. If you come upon a truck/train accident stay up wind and as far away as possible. Keep binoculars in your vehicle and spot the Department of Transportation sign for the product in the trailer or train cars. Stay alert on the highways and by-ways. Now is also a great time to get your vehicles into shape for that long trip if evacuation is your preferred action. You need to check your Route A, then plan Route B, and back up with Route C. The local Highway department does NOT post plans for road closures very far in advance so pay attention to local news announcements and alter your plans accordingly.

Learn the planned evacuation zones and when to evacuate. The real plan is to go early and beat the rush.

A good practice event for a disaster will be the 8 June, 2019 South Carolina Communications exercise. Information is available at www.aressc.org. I will be at Charleston County Emergency Operations Center during the drill. Expect to be called on for simulated traffic and emergency assignments. This will test the state's ability to get timely reports from the Low Country and get the proper aid en route to help everybody in the Hurricane's zone.

Another good event is ARRL Field Day. June 21, 2019 is set up day on the Yorktown starting at 1400 until ready. Field Day starts at 1400 on 22 June, 2019 and runs until 1400 23 June, 2019. 24 hours of operations with tear down after the event. AS in years past we will be operating from outside of the club room just like in a field. Hope to see everyone there. And for the newer ham's you can operate HF because of Control Operators being present so come out and enjoy perhaps a different facet of Amateur Radio.
