FROM YOUR VICE PRESIDENT

Things have been a bit anti-climactic after Museum Ships and Field Day. The high heat index doesn't lend itself to outdoor activities in July.

It's summer; peak E-skip season. If you have 6m capability, try it. There is a lot of activity on 6m FT8. 6m (50MHz) is called the "magic band" due to its characteristics; one of which is power needed. You can go a long way on 25 watts. Give it a try. If you're not set up for digital, monitor 50.125 MHz for phone activity.

There's a local "weak signal" digital net Sunday and Wednesday evenings on 145.700 MHz SSB. If you have an all-band all-mode radio like a Yaesu FT-991 give it a listen (8pm Wed, 830pm Sunday). We use the digital mode Contestia 64/1000, which W1HKJ's FLDIGI software supports. Give us a listen and check in if you can. Reception reports are welcome at aj4uq@arrl.net.

As always, if there's something you want to learn, let the club leadership know and we'll try to find someone to educate us on it.
