Free to a good home: I recently received a donation of equipment from a local ham who's downsizing, and requested that it be given to a "freshly caught ham". There ended up being 4 boxes of gear and miscellaneous parts. Among the items I have are: Kenwood 430S HF radio, 20A linear power supply, 5/8 wave VHF mag mount antenna, low pass filter, home brew antenna tuner, 2m amp, Kantronics KAM TNC, Uniden BC170 scanner, several parts bins of antenna parts, electrical components, connectors (decent junk box fare), and an assortment of cables and wires. I verified that the Kenwood and power supply power up, but lacking a microphone or proper antenna setup, I can't say how functional the radio is aside from turning on. The radio might work perfectly, or it might not. This is perhaps not the ideal piece of equipment for

someone completely new to HF, but would be good for someone looking for something to tinker with. Anybody who is interested in any or all of this stuff, send me an email.

The 2m skip is starting up, and FT8 is popular there. If you have an all-band-all-mode radio like a Yaesu FT-991, turn your VHF antenna horizontal and see what you find. My best DX on 2m FT8 is Texas!

On my to-do list is explore LoRA, a low power networking protocol for internet of things devices. There are a few gateways in my part of West Ashley, so I plan to use RTL-SDR to find them, then explore sensor devices to connect. Look for it in the 900MHz ISM band. It's almost certain that we won't be able to meet in person for our April membership meeting. The club officers are discussing having a meeting-on-the-air. On Monday at 7pm an officer will call it into session on the linked repeaters and we'll proceed through our regular reports. The bylaws require a quorum to conduct business, so if needed we'll call for members to check-in. We're also looking into a telephone conference call to support those without repeater access.
