#### **NEWS FROM THE VP**

We've had our first storm for the season, and in a sign of how crazy 2020 has been, it barely generated a buzz with people. I'm not sure if it's complacency or weariness; maybe people are just realizing that they're a little tougher and better prepared than before.

The state emergency management teams are rethinking how to communicate during an incident. If you've listened to the recent exercises on the repeaters, you've probably noticed that voice is not the best method for conveying structured lists of information. So if you haven't looked into it yet, now is the time to consider exploring digital (computer to computer) communications. I've been asked to give some introductions at the club station, as Rick notes above.

You can explore digital modes without any special equipment (or even a radio) by using the web-based software-defined radios (WebSDR) across the world. Find a station at <a href="www.websdr.org">www.websdr.org</a>, then use a "virtual audio cable" program to link your web browser audio to software like FLdigi to decode data. There are YouTube videos and other instructions out there if you can't wait for the CARS sessions.

# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS - SEPTEMBER

Hurricane season is ramping up again. Josephine and Kyle have come and gone so next up is Laura and Marco. Charleston area has been lucky with little to no damage from storms A thru K storms, keep up to date on the Atlantic Basin as I write this there are two (2) invests (96 & 98) with a third ready to come off of Africa Hurricane season peaks around September 15 and ends 30 November. Now is the time to check your gear, batteries, lights, vehicles, food storage, power options, etc., etc.

Make your plans on evacuating or hunkering down now because of COVID shelter space in Charleston County is at less than 700 occupants for the whole county. COVID safety protocols also dictate only 1 Ham operator at a time in the EOC or

shelter. Shift change will mean securing from the net, sanitizing the station, leaving the area, new shift enters area rejoins the net. So for a limited time communications will be unavailable. I believe overflow (>700) will be bused to Berkeley and Dorchester Counties initially. I am asking for Ham's to volunteer to assist Berkeley and Dorchester at shelters where Charleston County residents will be sheltered. Another location for ARES members especially will be Hospitals as a staged back-up for any communications issues arising. South Carolina Tactical Communications Plan will split the SCHEART repeaters out. VHF will be for tactical communications between EOCs and State EOC. UHF will be for Medical communications.

If you have extra equipment; HTs, battery packs, antenna, etc., think about storing them in a Dry Bag/Box in case you have to move during the event. Wet radios might not work well.

Finally, now is the time to check your routes and to know where alternate shelters are located in case you have to go to a shelter or you have to move should your assigned shelter get compromised.

## TESTING YOUR RADIO VIA REPEATER

At certain times we are not able to get a radio check from a fellow HAM. The following test can assist you from becoming frustrated.

If you press the DTMF keys in a sequence, you can get feedback from the controller.

Key your mic and identify yourself and then press the number 3 twice (33) and un-key. The repeater should come back with the date and time.

Key your mic and identify yourself and then press the number 4 twice (44) and un-key. The repeater should come back and say something like "ready to record". Key your mic and say a sentence or two and un-key. The repeater should repeat your messages back to you and you should hear what you really sound like. Key your mic and identify yourself and then press the number 5 twice (55) and un-key. Now when you press any DTMF key(s) the repeater will tell you what keys you pressed.

This information only goes through the repeater you are tuned to, not over the linked system.
