NEWS FROM THE VP

2020 was quite a year. I don't think I'll miss it. Hopefully many of you were able to fill your time improving your skills and equipment. I couldn't operate as much as I hoped due to the family being home all the time. Having an attic antenna means you can't do much operating when teenagers are sleeping until noon one floor down. OFCOM, the UK's equivalent to our FCC, has a spreadsheet to help you evaluate exposure levels at your station: https://www.ofcom.org.uk/__data/assets/file/0022/2 04529/emf-calculator-v0.1.1.xlsx.

The Christmas bombing in Nashville exposed a surprising lack of redundancy and automatic failover in our telecommunications infrastructure. Damage to one central office affected landlines, cellular, and internet service across multiple states, with a cascading impact for users like aviation, 911 centers, and electric utilities. The CARS, TARC, and HEARTS repeaters are linked by radio to minimize that risk to us, and those RF links can be redirected in case of a site failure. Remember that when everybody wants to use the repeaters at once, a best practice is to establish a net to ensure orderly access. That's why familiarizing yourself with net operations is so important. Go the extra mile and practice your net control skills on the Thursday Newcomers Net.

I did get myself a radio in a pre-Christmas deal. Airspy had a great discount on their HF+ Discovery SDR receivers and magnetic loop antennas. I connected mine to a Raspberry Pi server and my wifi, so now I can monitor HF and VHF on my laptop anywhere in the house. SDR dongles are incredibly powerful and you can get a competent one starting around \$20.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS -JANUARY

January 2021!!! Hooray a new year and hopefully a better year.

January is a month of interesting weather – cold one day – warm the next. It seems like all of the snow and ice storms come in January. Get out that extra blanket or coat for the house and your vehicle. A car cools down as fast in winter as it heats up in summer so be prepared instead of reacting after you are stuck freezing. Put a pair of boots in your vehicle too, walking in snow, ice, or slush is hard enough but without good waterproof shoes wet feet only make you colder.

In December we had high winds when a front came through the Low Country. High winds usually mean trees down, taking down power lines, and many home heating systems require electricity to function. Be sure to read the instructions on alternative heaters. Every year people die from improper use of space heaters, kerosene heaters, and other devices. Be a good neighbor and check in on elderly friends on cold days to make sure they are alright.

NEW FCC LICENSE FEES

As this Carrier is being finished, the FCC released their Report and Order on "Amendment of the Schedule of Application Fees Set Forth in Sections 1.1102 through 1.1109 of the Commission's Rules." In short, this updates fees for FCC licenses, including Amateur Radio.

Most actions other than simple administrative updates (e.g. change of address) will incur a \$35 fee. Pass the technician test? Pay \$35 to activate your license. Ditto for upgrades, vanity call signs, and ten-year renewals. The fees won't take effect until the FCC can update its computers and get the word out, which will take at least 30 days.

It's not clear how the fees for new licenses and upgrades will be handled. What we can recommend is that if you're studying for an upgrade, schedule a test now before the fees start. If you want a vanity call sign, apply now. If you're within 90 days of your license expiring, renew now.

In other actions, the FCC is removing the option for receiving a paper copy of your license. They are moving to all-electronic communication, and will require an email address for all users in the ULS. You should log into ULS and ensure you have an email address on file.
