EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

One more month closer to Hurricane Season. We spend a large amount of disaster planning for Hurricane season BUT there are many other issues Mother Nature can use to strike the Low Country.

Springtime is a time of severe weather like tornadoes, heavy rains, and flooding of waterways and streets. High tides and full moon cycles plus on shore winds can and will cause street flooding and the follow-on damage to life and property. Stay aware, flooded streets are dangerous, remember "Turn around Don't drown." Also be aware of the movements of wildlife due to flooding or controlled burning in the forests. A week ago I saw a 6' alligator in the canal by Rivers and Eagle Landing Rd. Remember wildlife can hurt or even kill you.

Some supplies seem to be limited right now so I think you need to start stocking up for Hurricane Season ASAP. Remember the "Great Toilet Paper" shortage from two (2) years ago. Check out your other/standby radios and associated equipment. PL- 259's get corroded, bent, broken, or just stored badly rendering your coax less than useful without repair. An emergency is not the ideal repair window. I recently had a poorly stored electrical cord fail due to a loose connection – check your spare gear.

Come out to the James Island Expo on May 7, 2022 from 10:00 AM till 2:00 PM at the Lowes parking lot just off the James Island Connector and Folly Rd. The CARS trailer will be set up for communications demonstrations. You will also be able to go around to other Government and Non Government agencies like ARES and CERT. Find out which agency can be most helpful in a disaster for your issues. Hopefully more of these events will occur as summer and Hurricane Season approaches.

Question: How many ARES members can work in a portable environment? What equipment do you use? What is is in your repair kits? Think about this and start or improve your emergency repair tool kits.

MINUTES of the MARCH MEETING

Monday April 11, 2022 at 7:00 PM

MINUTES: The Charleston Amateur Radio Society, Inc. Meeting was called to order by President Rick Valentine, N8BKN, at 7:00 PM on Monday April 11, 2022, at the Golden Corral in North Charleston, SC.

Introductions: There was only about 43 members and 2 guests at the meeting

Secretary's Minutes: Warren, KK4EVI: The March 2022 meeting minutes were published in the April 2022 CARS Carrier. A motion was made to accept the minutes as published, the motion was seconded and passed.

Treasurer's Report: Charlotte, KJ4PLX: The February 2022 Financial Reports were published in the April 2022 newsletter and accepted as information.

Hamfest Report: Steve, KE4THX: No report

Repeater Report: Bryce K4LXF: Bryce, K4LXF, gave a brief history on the CARS repeaters. In 1971, the FCC allowed repeaters to use the 146.940 frequency. The linking system was formed by two nurses at MUSC. In 1977, the CARS club was named. The repeater controllers have 3 ports, port 1, is the main repeater port. Port 2, is the port used for linking. Port 3 is used as a hub. Also mentioned the LowCountry repeaters have useful functions: after keying up, hit the 3 key twice then unkey, will give you the date and time. Only 3 repeaters have backup clocks, the others will need to be manually reset. After keying up, hit the 4 key twice, then unkey will (should) activate the repeat function, for radio checks. And after keying up, hit the 5 key twice, then unkey, will repeat back what DTMF keys you press. Shows if they are working or not.
