EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Hurricane season has arrived and one (1) month down, only 5 more months to go. The Gulf of Mexico has an area of rain that could develop into a storm but low chance is given. Around South America there is a storm headed for Central America and on into the Pacific name will be Bonnie. Even a Cat One (1) storm can dump a lot of rain which can be more troublesome than wind damage. Remember Hurricane Florence devastated South and North Carolina with many inches of rain causing flooding, trees down, power down, but not much wind damage. A word of advice during Hurricane season keep your vehicle fuel tank at least half full all of the time. If you have to leave the area you have fuel to get out some distance where fuel may be easier to find and continue your trip. Also keep 3 days food supply on hand since stores may be empty, and road trips with children and pets can be miserable without snacks and toys. Take water and food for your pets too. No one wants to hear "Are we there yet?" over and over.

Now is a good time to check out your portable station. If you did Field Day you surely found things you could do better or a piece of gear you needed or wanted available. Also time to start planning for next year.

Try a new operating mode for communications. One of the newer forms is called VARA. It is a digital mode that works on HF and VHF/UHF FM. So long or short distance message traffic can be used. Think about how South Carolina Emergency Communications work. Individual operators contact their local County Emergency Operations Center and the County EOC will contact the State EOC. Also since VARA is a digital mode a written copy of the message is produced. The purpose of written messages is FEMA can use them for repaying County expenses.

OUR FIRST MOBILE MARINE POTA ACTIVATION

It was a clear and sunny day on Saturday, June 18, perfect for an activation at K-0518 Cape Romain from my Bayliner 185 with first mate Rich Lorenzo, K4ZRL. We also brought fishing poles and a BBQ grill and the ladies joined us for a fun day out.

We installed a 17' whip on the side of my boat with a bronze grounding plate mounted under the hull to use the salt water as a counterpoise, in place of floating out radial wires that could get tangled in the prop. We got a great SWR match right away using my IC-7300.



We launched from Rivers Edge Marina on the Ashley River at 9:30am and arrived at Garris Landing around 11:00am. However the boat dock was closed, so we found another dock further up the Intracoastal Waterway, but still within the park boundaries.

We activated around noon and right away had a continuous log jam. In less than 30 minutes we logged 25 QSOs from Ontario to Texas and everywhere in between with really good signal reports. If you have a boat you need to try this.

We didn't catch any fish but those BBQ ribs and chicken my wife Evie cooked up were delicious as well the sides Rich and Marsha brought. Plus the water was warm for a swim.


A POTA TRIP UPSTATE
