EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

June is gone and we are now in July, month two of Hurricane season. Three named storms already with the peak between August 15 and September 10. Storms so far this year have been different than in any specific years past, we have had one in the Gulf of Mexico that went South and two that came off of Africa; unusual for this early in the season. Keep your weather radio on and watch for severe weather that everyone knows is still to come. Start getting your plans together now. When asked at a Club meeting the number of people evacuating increased as storm intensified. Hurricanes can provide time to prepare for, but other severe weather or disasters just happen, prepare now.

Check your supplies from years past, batteries do expire, medications expire, food stored can go bad, so rotate your supplies. Also remember any specific supplies like road games for family members including your pets.

Double check your planned evacuation routes. Road construction, flooded roadways, and detours can affect your route. Make a travel plan and route to outside of area family, it will give them an opportunity to expect your arrival or should a break down occur a starting point and route to give to law enforcement to aid you.

Charleston County EMD uses a combination of text messaging, emails, and conference calls to notify of activations. The county tried out the system recently and found some issues. I tried to call in and the phone number worked but I had difficulty with the group number, also got the e-mail after the call started so I will present this information to Charleston County EMD for improvement from the Amateur community. Stay tuned for further developments.




FIELD DAY
