EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

I want to thank everyone that participated in the March South Carolina Emergency Management Division's Full-Scale Exercise (FSX). The State tested their communications skills and tested the Amateur Radio skills too. Look for a full briefing as the After-Action Reports get reviewed. I hope everyone that participated learned what they could or could not accomplish and have a plan to improve their skills and potential need for different equipment or operating mode. The next Emergency Management test will be on June 5, 2024 for Charleston County and is expected to be a hurricane right as we start Hurricane Season. Stay tuned for more details if I get them. Again, thank you for the Earthquake drill support.

Hurricane season starts again in June and the preliminary expectations are for a more active season this year over last year so prepare now. This prediction always changes as we get closer to June 1st so stay ready.

There are various websites that provide up to date information. One of my favorite sites is the National Hurricane Center in Florida. They have a dedicated Amateur Radio station that gets activated when a storm is 5 days out from the U.S. The frequency used is 14.325MHz USB for daytime and 7.268MHz LSB nighttime or when propagation is bad on twenty meters. Another frequency is the Caribbean Emergency Net which is 7.188MHz LSB, usually active before and during the NHC nets. Save these frequencies even if you cannot

operate them, you can always listen and stay up to date on the storm's location, direction, and strength.

If you have never been through a severe storm before, ask your neighbors or ARES members for help. Every storm I have been involved in I learn new or different things to do better. But do not lock in on Hurricanes as the only natural danger in this area. Springtime offers prime conditions for severe Thunderstorms, flash flooding, and tornadoes. Remember that trees only fall down on power lines, roads, cars, or wherever the most inconvenient locations are.

And lastly, share your experience with others, do not make them learn the hard way. Remember the great toilet paper shortage during COVID. Start stocking up a little every week, do not wait till the last minute, there may be nothing available.

Which brings up a good point – one doesn't need to send morse to participate. If you can copy CW, you can sit next to the operator and log the QSOs. There will be plenty of back-up. I cannot underestimate this opportunity to learn CW. FD comes once a year and that's where I learned it more than anywhere else!

We will have a sideband (voice) station for those who prefer using a microphone and a Get-on-the-Air (GOTA) station for visitors.

The CW station will include digital modes.
