# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

We are one month away from the start of the 2025 Hurricane season. Storms do occur in May; they form offshore and only give a day or two warning unlike African storms that provide a week or more preparation time. Stay vigilant and plan now to stay or evacuate.

If you choose to evacuate, make a route A, route B, and a route C. Drive your route on a sunny day and a rainy day. Look for gas stations or recharging stations, look for food services and other safety needs. Have your medications ready to go, may take you some time to refill a prescription outside of this area. Pack important papers so they are available to you.

If you are planning to stay, start stockpiling supplies that may get scarce after the storm hits. Get some cash out because plastic might not work initially, small bills because making change will be difficult.

Operate your generator if you have one to make sure it still works and is in a safe area not located where you will be breathing the exhaust fumes. Tune to the weather radio frequencies for the latest weather reports, you can get a dedicated weather radio or most Amateur HT's will tune in the weather frequencies. Remember FEMA's safety rules: Make sure YOU are safe, then make sure your FAMILY is safe. If steps one and two are met then you can aid the community through ARES or other voluntary agencies. Help your local neighborhood out, CERT is trained to seek out a Ham operator to communicate with the Municipality or County Emergency Management Departments. Review a copy of the current SC Tactical communications plan for procedures, frequencies, and individual County repeaters and Simplex frequencies.

# **SPECIAL PROJECTS**

The automatic packet reporting service (APRS) station WA4USN-5 on the Yorktown is both a digipeater and an iGate. This means it retransmits packets over the air similar to a repeater, and it has an internet connection to share packets globally, such as to the mapping service on <a href="http://aprs.fi">http://aprs.fi</a>. It can relay messages from a radio in Charleston to

one in a different place if that other radio has been heard by an iGate.

APRS remains a useful tool for delivering information in short chunks. It is also used by some private pilots so don't be surprised if you see packets coming from 10,000 feet in the air (or higher, from a high-altitude balloon).
